Covered Services

Final services will be determined in consultation with the participating tribes and may include:

- Personal care
- Skilled nursing
- Case management
- Adult day services
- Transportation
- Home-delivered meals
- Limited dental services
- Counseling
- Self-direction for services
- Transition funds for housing needs

Who Qualifies?

Members of federally recognized tribes in Oklahoma may be eligible if they meet the following criteria:

- 19 years old and older
- Lived for more than 60 days in an inpatient facility (nursing or intermediate care)
- Interested in moving back to the community
- Eligible for SoonerCare at least one day before leaving the inpatient facility
